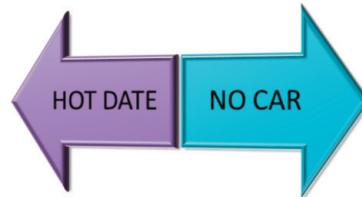
# CONFLICT

### Conflict: person versus person
